Graduation Requirements!

Students will have basic knowledge of infection control and laws and regulations, and pass with a 70% or better to receive a certificate of completion from SoCal ROC. In addition, students must complete a minimum of 1000 hours of technical instruction and practical hands-on training in order to be eligible to take the written exam for licensing with the California Board of Barbering and Cosmetology.
