The Southern California Regional Occupational Center (SoCal ROC) offers career technical education (CTE) for high school and adult learners, providing hands-on training in fields like construction, healthcare, and creative media. Instruction is led by industry experts, aligning with local job market needs to facilitate employment or further education. Support services include externships, industry certifications, and career counseling, helping a diverse population, including career changers, become job-ready.

Short-Term and Flexible Industry Training

- Enjoy flexible scheduling options, including afternoon and evening courses, allowing adults to balance education with work and family commitments.
- Schedule: (Monday to Thursday) or (Monday/Wednesday) or (Tuesday/Thursday)
- Timing: Classes are available in the morning, afternoon, and evening.

Graduate Workforce Ready

- Access to Practical Skills: Career technical education (CTE) programs focus on providing hands-on, practical skills that are directly applicable to the workplace, making it easier for adults to transition into new roles or advance in their current careers.
- Enhanced Employment Opportunities: CTE programs often align with industry needs, ensuring that participants gain relevant skills that are in high demand, thereby increasing their competitiveness in the job market.
