Support services include externships, industry certifications, and career counseling, helping a diverse population, including career changers, become job-ready.

### **Short-Term and Flexible Industry Training**

- Enjoy flexible scheduling options, including afternoon and evening courses, allowing adults to balance education with work and family commitments.
- Schedule: (Monday to Thursday) or (Monday/Wednesday) or (Tuesday/Thursday)
- Timing: Classes are available in the morning, afternoon, and evening.
