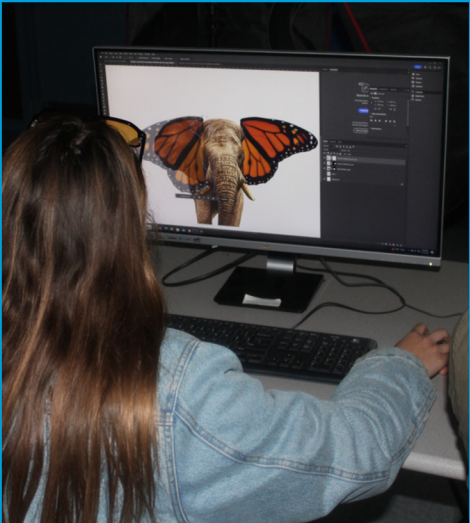

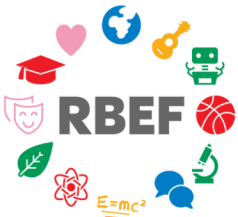
ACCREDITATION

Tuition & Course Fees

Tuition will be charged as noted and includes a non-refundable \$25 registration fee. Some courses may require additional course fees for textbooks and/or other materials. Full payment of tuition and course fees is required to finalize course registration.

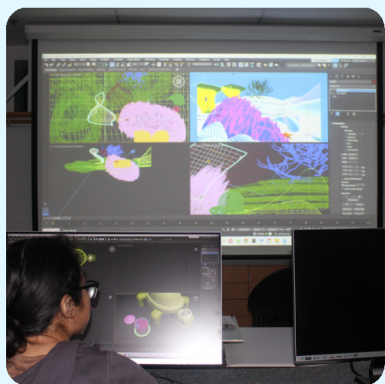

General Electrician

The skills you will learn are in high-demand and can be applied in all areas of electrical installation. Our General Electrician program is state approved and is a 2 semester program. Upon completion of the entire program, students will be eligible to obtain an Electrical Trainee Card (ET Card) and receive education credit hours. Electrical trainees are not the same as apprentices. The difference between an apprentice and a trainee is that an apprenticeship program may last between three to four years. An electrical trainee can register for an ET card, and then can work full or part-time on the job supervised under a licensed electrician.

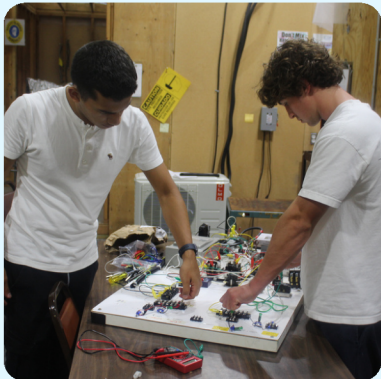

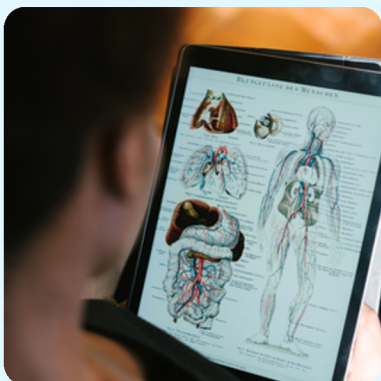

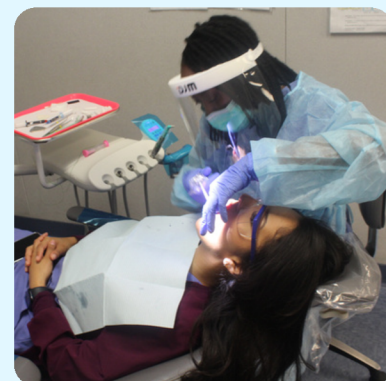
Dental Assisting
