### Plumbing - Journeyman Preparation

This course is designed to prepare individuals for the Journeyman Plumber Examination as outlined by the County of Los Angeles Department of Public Works, Building and Safety Division. A Journeyman Plumber is defined as "a person who installs, alters or repairs plumbing as an employee, who does not furnish any materials or supplies, and who is the legal possessor of a Journeyman Plumber's Certificate" (Los Angeles County Plumbing Code, Section 105.2.5, 2002). The course provides a comprehensive review of plumbing codes, regulations, and practical knowledge necessary to pass the examination administered by the Board of Examiners. It also covers the application process, fee requirements, and experience prerequisites—specifically, a minimum of four years of plumbing work experience.

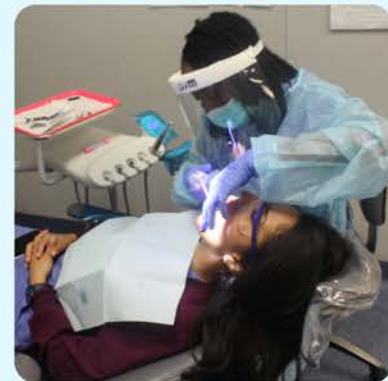
